**NTPC Group achieves over 100 Billion Units of cumulative generation in the current financial year**

(By Press Information Bureau)

NTPC Group companies under Ministry of Power have achieved over 100 Billion Units (BU) of cumulative generation in the current financial year, reinforcing group's commitment towards excellence in operation. Last year the group generation had crossed 100 BU on 7th August 2020, indicating improved performance and an increase in demand for power in the current year. NTPC group companies recorded a generation of 85.8 BU in the first quarter from April to June 2021, registering an increase of 26.3% from 67.9 BU generated in the corresponding quarter last year. On a standalone basis, NTPC generation increased by 19.1% to 71.7 BU in the first quarter from April to June 2021, compared to the 60.2 BU generated in the corresponding quarter last year. NTPC Korba (2600 MW) in Chattisgarh is the top performing thermal power plant in India with 97.61% Plant Load Factor (PLF) between April to June 2021, as per the data published by Central Electricity Authority (CEA). Further 37-year-old, NTPC Singrauli Unit 4 (200 MW) in Uttar Pradesh, achieved 102.08% PLF, highest in the country, from April to June 2021. This demonstrates the expertise of NTPC in Operation and Maintenance of the power plants and the high levels of operational excellence. With a total installed capacity of 66085 MW, NTPC Group has 71 Power stations including 29 Renewable projects. NTPC has set a target to install 60 gigawatts (GW) of renewable energy (RE) capacity by 2032. NTPC is also India's first energy company to declare its energy compact goals as part of the UN High-level Dialogue on Energy (HLDE).

## Training on latest farm practices: Niranjan

**Hyderabad, July 16 (IPA) :** Agriculture Minister S Niranjan Reddy today instructed the farmers to cultivate crops which have better demand in the open market. He held a review meeting at Nagar Kurnool with officials and local leaders on the farming activities in Kharif season.

Niranjan Reddy directed the officials of the agriculture sector to conduct timely awareness camps to the farming community on international demand for the crops. We have to focus on their cultivation and help the farmers gain more, he said. The state government is now supporting the farmers to cultivate commercial crops, oil palm production and others which have greater demand in the open market, he said. Provide skills and training to cultivate fine rice, crops that fetch benefits he asked the extension officers. Ensure that Yasangi crops come to yield by next March, the minister said.

The minister instructed the officials concerned to educate and offer training to the farmers on the latest farm practices. Ensure that the farmers in the state cultivate commercial crops and others which have the best demand in the market.

## 83% of engineers in India want to switch jobs amid pandemic: Survey

**New Delhi, July 16 (IPA) :** About 83 per cent of engineers in India are looking for a change of job amid the ongoing pandemic, but the majority relies on free learning resources even though there is no guarantee of learning or of a job, revealed a survey.

The survey, by IP-driven incubation lab BridgeLabz, was conducted over 1000 people to find out how the pandemic has affected the professional growth of engineers. It showed that while most want a job change, only 21 per cent are enrolled in any kind of structured course for upskilling. As per the survey, about 58 per cent of the respondents were fresh graduates and are still looking for a job. More than 50 per cent of respondents feel work-

**New Delhi, July 16 (IPA) :** Congress leader and former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Kamal Nath met Congress president Sonia Gandhi amid speculation over his future role in the party. Mr. Nath's name is doing the rounds for a bigger role in the revamped Congress organisation. Mr. Nath has been a veteran of the party and shares good ties with senior party leaders including those part of the group of 23 leaders who had written to the Congress chief seeking the organisation's overhaul.

The former chief minister's meeting also comes ahead of the Monsoon session of Parliament. Mr. Nath shares good relations with leaders of some opposition parties. Mr. Nath had also recently met Sharad Pawar at his Delhi residence, after the NCP chief met some opposition leaders amid talk of the formation of a larger opposition front against the BJP.

## YSRC wants KRMB jurisdiction notified

**Vijayawada, July 16 (IPA) :** The YSR Congress Party will speak on the alleged illegal projects taken up by Telangana and seek notifying the Krishna River Management Board jurisdiction in the Parliament, according to Rajya Sabha member Vijay Sai Reddy.

Talking to media persons here after a meeting of the YSRC Parliamentary Party here on Thursday, he said that the Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jaganmohan Reddy had given the MPs a direction on the strategy to be adopted during the monsoon session of the Parliament to be held from July 19 to August 13. The party would reiterate its demands on implementation of bifurcation promises and special category status for Andhra Pradesh for which it had been fighting since the beginning, he stated.

## PIL accuses TN Road Development Corporation of obliterating water bodies in Padur for OMR Phase II project

**Chennai, July 16 (IPA) :** The Madras High Court expressed shock over an allegation levelled by a public interest litigant that the Tamil Nadu Road Development Corporation (TNRDC) was destroying water bodies in Padur village for the Old Mahabalipuram Road (OMR) Phase II project in Chengalpattu district.

Chief Justice Sanjib Banerjee and Justice Senthil Kumar Ramamoorthy told government counsel P. Muthukumar that damage to water bodies appeared to be happening on the stretch of OMR, touted as the Rajiv Gandhi Information Technology Expressway, dotted by several wetlands and marshlands. “Many constructions over there involve desecration of water bodies. The State cannot indulge in such things. De-

velopment has to be sustainable. There ought to be elevated corridors. Statutory authorities have to consider it. Ask your officials to visit the place,” the Chief Justice told the counsel. The Bench also called for a status report on the issue from TNRDC within three weeks. The interim order was passed on a public interest litigation petition filed by S. Sridhar, a resident of Padur. He had complained about the water sources in his village being obliterated due to the OMR Phase II project. The petitioner said that the TNRDC had protected the water bodies in

Kelambakkam village by constructing bridges at appropriate places but chose to construct the expressway right on the water bodies in Padur inhabited by more than 20,000 families dependant on those water bodies for drinking and fishing.

The petitioner said even the cows, buffaloes, goats, dogs and birds had been deprived of water sources. He claimed that the civil contractors engaged by TNRDC had destroyed the Kalleri lake and Padur pond which were home to fish, snails and other living organisms. He said the two water bodies were now filled with debris.

## Free Covid-19 vaccine drive at Osmania University

**Hyderabad, July 16 (IPA) :** Osmania University (OU) is organising free Covid-19 vaccination drive at University College of Arts and Social Sciences, OU campus, on July 16 and 17. All faculty members, employees, research scholars and students of the university can get vaccinated between 9 am and 1 pm. Interested candidates should carry their Aadhaar card and university employee or student ID mandatorily to avail the facility, the OU said.



**Patna, July 16 (IPA) :** Ahead of the upcoming monsoon session of the Bihar legislature from July 26, Opposition Leader Tejashwi Yadav has written a letter to the Speaker saying Opposition legislators were scared to enter the Assembly due to the March 23 incident in which they were brutally thrashed by district policemen.

“Our MLAs are now afraid to enter the House and raising questions there. I’ve asked the re-

spected Speaker to let us know the result of the investigation, if he had done any, on the March 23 incident. That was a black day which will never be forgotten”, said Mr. Yadav.

“Whether in the Assembly or on the road, anyone who asks questions related to public interest is being thrashed in this government headed by Nitish Kumar”, added Mr. Yadav.

On March 23, the Patna district administration entered the Assembly and thrashed Opposition legislators opposing the Bihar Special Armed Police Bill, 2021, which was tabled by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar to empower the Bihar Military Police. The Opposition MLAs claimed the Bill was draconian in nature and “gives sweeping power to the police to arrest anyone”.

Meanwhile, principal Opposition party Rashtriya Janata Dal has announced it would stage a Statewide protest on July 18 and 19 against the rising prices of fuel, cooking gas, fertilizers and edible commodities.

“Life has become unbearable for common people, especially after Covid-19 pandemic”, Mr. Yadav said, adding other alliance partners too would be urged to join the protest.

## Women activists observe “anti-repression day” in Manipur

**Imphal, July 16 (IPA) :** Several women activists observed “anti-repression day” in Manipur on Thursday against the alleged atrocities by the security forces and demanding the withdrawal of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958. However in view of the COVID-19 restrictions and ongoing curfew, the functions were low key affairs. The activists said the personnel of the 17 Assam Rifles garrisoned at Kangla, an old palace in the heart of the Imphal city, had arrested a young girl on July 11, 2004 from her house at Bamon Kampu in Imphal east district. Charged with being a member of a proscribed underground organisation, she was allegedly tortured and “gang-raped”. It was alleged she was later taken out of the camp and shot

dead. One woman activist said, “The girl was in her parents’ home, helping them by weaving handloom clothes.”

Every year the women activists observe “anti-repression day” on July 15.

The official explanation was that she volunteered to take some personnel to a place where sophisticated weapons were stashed. On the way, she requested that she be allowed to answer nature’s call. It was stated that she tried to escape despite warning shouts. Shots were fired to stop her. However she was fatally hit. The activists do not believe this. Some of them said even if she had tried to escape despite being blindfolded and handcuffed, the soldiers could have overpowered her without resorting to firing.



**Jagitial, July 16 (IPA) :** Road connectivity between to several villages in Metpalli area was cut off as minor irrigation projects, streams and rivulets were overflowing following incessant rain in the last 24 hours. The highest rainfall of 145.3 mm was recorded in Kathalapur mandal, resulting in swollen streams, rivulets and ponds that started overflowing. Road connectivity between Ramannapeta and Athmakur villages was affected as flood waters

flowed over a low level bridge. Flood water was also overflowing near Jaggasagar. Traffic was also affected between Kathalapur and Bhushanraopet as a bridge constructed across the flood flow canal was overflowing. Meanwhile, flood waters entered houses in Chinthakunta of Kathalapur mandal following overflowing rivulets and tanks. Rallavagu project was overflowing on the outskirts of Bhushanraopet.
