



Police recruitment physical tests in Hanmakonda today

Hanamkonda, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : The police have made all arrangements to conduct the physical fitness tests for those aspiring for posts of Stipendiary Police Constables and Sub-Inspectors at the Kakatiya University campus grounds here. The physical efficiency tests will be held from December 8 to January 3. A total of 24,612 candidates from erstwhile Warangal district is appearing for these examinations. Among them, 19,651 are male and 4,961 are female. These tests will commence at 5 am on Thursday. We appeal to the candidates appearing for these tests to bring the admit card, intimation letter, Part-2 of the appli-

cation printed copy with self-signature of the candidate, community, ex-service man certificates,” Warangal Police Commissioner AV Ranganath said. CCTV cameras have been installed at the ground. All the candidates will be under surveillance, and after checking the documents of the candidates, biometric verification will be done. So candidates should be careful not to have mehendi and tattoos on their fingers. After completion of biometric verification, digital radio frequency identification (RFID) wristbands will be handed over to each candidate. It remains on the candidate’s body till he leaves the ground. After the examination, the wristband will be removed under

the supervision of the officer. Candidates who remove or damage the wrist band during the examination will be disqualified,” he said. “1600 metres-run for male candidates and 800 meters run for women will be conducted. Candidates who qualify in the running are eligible for height measurements, long jump and shot put tests. These tests will be conducted from December 10 to 14 for women candidates,” the CP said, adding that the candidates appearing for these examinations would not be allowed to carry valuables such as cellphones, electronic devices and bags in the examination centre.

Auto driver kidnapped and beaten up in Hyderabad

Hyderabad, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : In a shocking incident, Mohd. Irfan alias Imran, an auto-rickshaw driver from Rajendranagar was kidnapped by three persons allegedly belonging to a rival gang. “It is learnt that the victim Imran was taken to a secluded spot in Rajendranagar and allegedly thrashed after removing his clothes.” They further warned him of dire consequences before fleeing from the spot. “Based on a complaint from Imran, the Rajendranagar police booked a case and are investigating.” It was learnt that Imran was earlier too attacked by the gang.

Hyderabadis spot strange object in sky, puzzled

Hyderabad, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : The Hyderabadis woke up to a ‘strange phenomenon’ in the sky on Wednesday. A white colour object appeared with many wondering if it is the planet, star, or alien ship, etc. “However, Planetary Society Of India Director Raghunandan clarified that it’s a research balloon sent by National Balloon Facility. Many were asking me about the white colour object that appeared in sky today at around 7:30 am. It is just a research helium balloon. It is basically sent for atmospheric studies. It carries an instrument weighing nearly 1,000 kg. Last month itself, the facility issued notice saying it will be releasing a research balloon,” he said. “Atmospheric research balloons help in calculating the pressure, temperature, humidity, and wind speed changes at various altitudes. Atmospheric sounding graphs are drawn from this, which helps in predicting weather.

Hyderabad police notice to MLA Raja Singh over derogatory post

Inspector of Mangalhat Police station has directed the MLA to reply within two days. It has been mentioned in the notice that Preventive Detention (PD) Act was invoked against Raja Singh for habitually delivering provocative and inflammatory speeches. While setting aside the police order invoking PD Act, the High Court had imposed certain conditions. The High Court had imposed the condition that the MLA shall not make any provocative speeches against any religion or post any derogatory or offensive posts on any social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, WhatsApp, YouTube. The police, however, said Raja Singh on December 6 made an objectionable post on Facebook targeting a particular community which is a violation of the condition imposed by the high Court. However, Raja Singh's lawyer Karuna Sagar denied that the MLA violated any condition. He said a reply to the show cause notice will be submitted soon. The lawyer termed the notice an abuse of power by the police.

Andhra student stuck between platform and train rescued

Hyderabad, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : Rescue workers saved a 20-year-old student after she was stuck in the gap between platform and a train at Duvvada railway station in Visakhapatnam district on Wednesday. Shashikala got stuck between the railway platform and the train while getting down from the Guntur-Rayagada Express. A student of MCA first year, she was on her way to college and had reached Duvvada from Annaram. While getting down



at the platform, she slipped and got stuck between platform and the train with her foot getting twisted and trapped in the track.

Govt teacher shares girl students' pics with strangers, suspended

Hyderabad, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : A government female teacher working in Babapur-Gangapur village in Chintalamanepalli Mandal was suspended after she allegedly shared pictures of girl students to unknown persons. An order to this effect was issued by District educational officer, Ashok on Tuesday evening, which stated that P Savitha, the school assistant of a high school in Babapur-Gangapur village was suspended for dereliction of duties, adverse attitude in the school in view of the smooth function of the institution. “The teacher was alleged to have discussed the consumption of liquor with students and was encouraging them to wear short dresses. She reportedly forced the students to speak to strangers over the phone, drawing the ire of the parents and student unions. “Her actions came to light after the unions staged a dharna demanding her suspension a few days back.



District SP participated in the constable's last rites

Adilabad, Dec 7 (TIM Bureau) : Adilabad District SP Uday Kumar Reddy participated in the last rites of the head constable who died due to heart attack. On Wednesday, during the visit of Chief Minister KCR of Jagityala district, Constable Chavan Parashuram of Indravelli Police Station from Adilabad district went to Jagityal. Chavan Parashuram died of a sudden heart attack while on duty on Tuesday evening as part of police security arrangements. On learning about this, District SP Uday Kumar Reddy went to Chavan Parashuram's native village of Utnoor mandal in Vadoni village on Wednesday morning and participated in the last rites of the victim constable

and conduced with the family. The SP expressed deep condolences to the family of Chavan Parashuram who laid down his life in the line of duty. Rs 20,000/- was given to the victim's family for funeral expenses. He said that he will work hard to provide all the government benefits to the family. The district SP assured the family that the district police system is always available for any help. 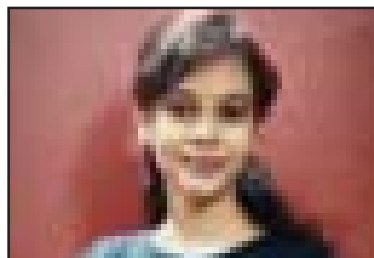
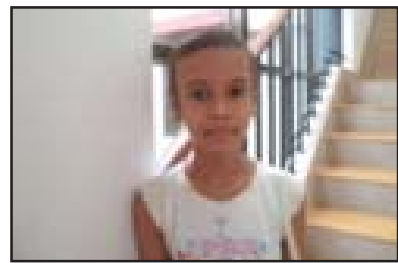
St.Judes' new vertical is a lifelong commitment to pediatric cancer survivors

“Many elderly people who are ignored by their children, are now living a dignified life due to the old age pension of Rs.2,000, rice supplied under ration card and benefits from other welfare schemes. There cannot be a better satisfaction in any elected representative’s life,” he said. Chandrashekhar Rao ruled out restricting the Rythu Bandhu financial support to farmers having less than five acres who constitute around 93.5 per cent of total farmers. He pointed out that even farmers with 30-40 acres in Mahabubnagar, Rangareddy, Nalgonda and Medak districts in erstwhile Andhra Pradesh, migrated to Hyderabad, Mumbai and even Dubai for livelihood, due to lack of irrigation facilities.

“We cannot deny financial support for such farmers who are less than 0.28 per cent,” he added. He said the State government achieved excellent results due to collective efforts of all employees and officers as well as elected representatives. The State government succeeded in supplying drinking water to every household under Mission Bhagiratha scheme with around 40,000 overhead tanks. He stated that Telangana was developing due to intellectual brainstorming in all fields and if everyone continues to work with more commitment, the State would make great strides.
